Whereas, The Congress, by Joint Resolution, has designated October of each year as “National Disability Employment Awareness Month”, and

Whereas, The purpose of this month is to celebrate the many and varied contributions of America’s worker’s with disabilities and educate the public about disability employment issues; and

Whereas, More than 50 million Americans, 18 percent of our population, have disabilities, and each is a family member, friend, neighbor, employee, and customer; and

Whereas, We want to spread the important message that a strong workforce is one inclusive of the skills and talents of all individuals, including individuals with disabilities; and

Whereas, We cannot afford, morally or financially, to lose the contributions that people with disabilities bring, not only to the workplace but also to mainstream community life as an irreplaceable resource for our state and nation; and

Whereas, We celebrate citizens, businesses and government working together to remove barriers and false perceptions faced by individuals with disabilities; and

Whereas, All persons with disabilities have the right and responsibility to be active, contributing members of society. “A Strong Workforce is An Inclusive Workforce: What Can You Do?” is this year’s theme.

Now, Therefore, I Dennis Daugaard, Governor of the State of South Dakota, do hereby proclaim October 2012 as

DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT AWARENESS MONTH

in South Dakota, and I call on all citizens to observe this month by hosting and supporting initiatives and activities that support and promote providing employment opportunities for people with disabilities.
